

Comedian Carl LaBove ordered to pay child support for Sam Kinison's child: Carl will request court hearing to examine existing DNA proof of Kinison paternity

Los Angeles -- Stand-up comic Carl LaBove is court ordered to pay child support for a child he did not father. On Thursday, February 17, 2011 at 10:30 AM Pacific time, LaBove will petition the Los Angeles Superior Court to stop the order by proving legendary comic Sam Kinison is the child's biological dad – not Carl LaBove. The court is at 111 North Hill Street, Los Angeles. A press conference will be held at 10:30 AM near the courthouse. Media are invited.

Sam Kinison died in a 1992 car accident. Sam was LaBove's best friend and colleague.

“The day my ex-wife blurted out that Sam had fathered my daughter – that was the day my life changed forever. I was devastated. But after all these years, I've learned to forgive. Now I'm just mad at the unjust law. I want to set the record straight and get my life back. I've been punished long enough for a crime that was committed in my bedroom. I've made it my mission to help others in my situation who are suffering from an unfair law,” said LaBove.

Carl has been unfairly hounded by the child support agency for nearly two decades. Carl's bank account has been invaded, his driver's license suspended, and his passport revoked due to alleged arrearages. This has hindered his ability to make a living and further his career. LaBove's basic American freedoms have been stripped from him due to these unjust punitive measures.

“My life has been crushed by the power of this agency,” said LaBove.

Carl will be accompanied to the courthouse by ACFC executive director, Mike McCormick. “We have a child support system that says it works in the best interest of children, yet in Carl's case, and countless others, the lives of men, women, and children are devastated by unconscionable and punitive child support measures.

How many Carl LaBoves are there? How will the court respond to the truth?"asked McCormick.

LaBove makes a special appearance in Los Angeles for the first time in 10 years on Wednesday, February 16th, at 10 PM Pacific at the Hollywood Improv at 8162 Melrose Avenue in Los Angeles. (323) 651-2583
